

# The IB Diploma and universities in Germany

Your IB Diploma qualifies you to study at top universities worldwide and is recognized as equivalent to the Abitur in Germany, which allows you to also study at German universities. However, each foreign school diploma needs to be checked by the German Zulassungsstelle and they need to confirm that your IB Diploma fulfils the additional requirements defined by the Kultusministerkonferenz as well.

According to the latest version of the resolution of the German Kultusministerkonferenz (“Vereinbarung über die Anerkennung des ‘International Baccalaureate Diploma/Diplôme du Baccalauréat International’”, revised March 7<sup>th</sup>, 2019) your IB Diploma will only be recognized as equivalent to the German Abitur and thus allow you to study in Germany if:

- you have completed **12 years of full-time schooling** including DP1 and DP2
- you have chosen **2 languages on an A or B level**. You need at least one continued foreign language as “Language A” or “Language B HL”.  
A language “ab initio” does not qualify you for studying at German universities!
- you have chosen at least **1 Science** subject (Biology, Chemistry, Physics)
- you have chosen **Mathematics** as a subject. **Mathematics SL is only recognized for students who complete their Mathematics exams in the 2020 exam sessions.** All students with exam sessions starting in 2021 or later must choose *Mathematics: Analysis and Approaches HL* or *Mathematics: Applications and Interpretation HL* to be able to study a subject related to Mathematics, Science or Technology at a German university. **If students (from Exam session 2021 onwards) decide to take Mathematics on SL, they will not qualify to study these subjects in Germany.**
- you have chosen **1 Individuals and Societies** subject (History, Geography, Economics, Psychology, Philosophy, Social Anthropology, Business and Management, Global Politics)
- you have **chosen a 6<sup>th</sup> subject from the above mentioned subjects**, a subject from group 6 (Visual Arts, Music, Theatre, **Film**, Literature and Performance) or from the following other IB subjects: a further foreign modern language, Latin, Classical Greek, General Chemistry, Applied Chemistry, Environmental Systems and Societies, Computer Science, Design Technology, World Religions, Sports exercise and health science.
- at least **one of your 3 HL subjects is either Mathematics or a Science subject** (Biology HL, Chemistry HL, Physics HL)
- you have **attended all your IB subjects in the Diploma Programme continuously for two years**
- you **score at least a grade 4 in all of your IB subjects and a minimum total of 24 points.** **If you have only one grade 3, you can compensate this with a grade 5 in another subject of the same level or higher** (meaning if you have a grade 3 in a HL, you need a 5 in another HL subject and the same for SL subjects. A SL subject can be compensated with a HL subject). **Having more than one grade 3 or even a grade 2 will not allow you to study in Germany.**

What happens if one or more of these aspects does not match your IB Diploma results?
